The Great Shift

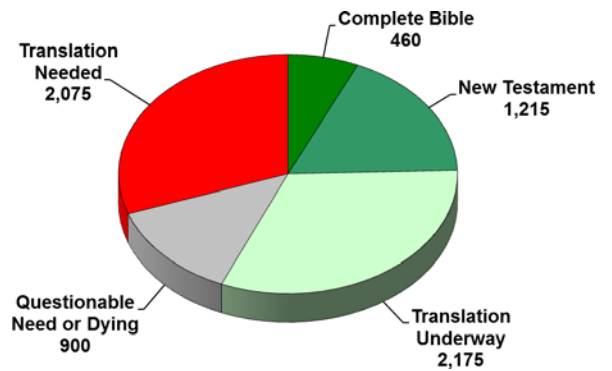
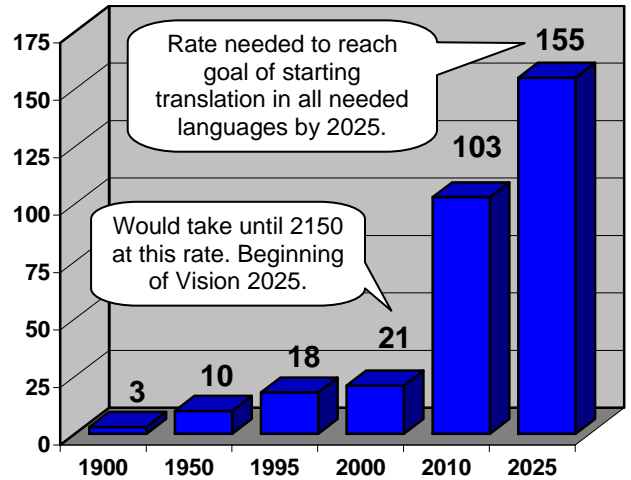
Year	% of all Christians in Europe and North America	% of all Christians in Latin America, Africa, Asia

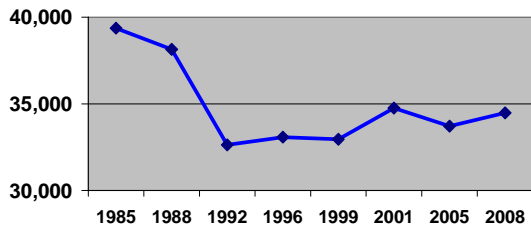
Acceleration of Bible Translation



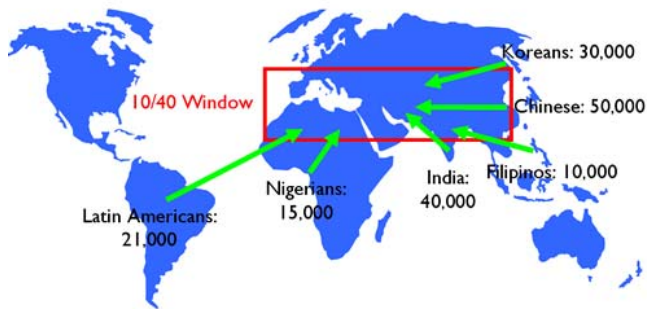
The New Testament has been translated into the mother tongue of over 83% of the world's population. However the remaining approximately 17% will require over 2,000 new translations.

Receivers to Senders

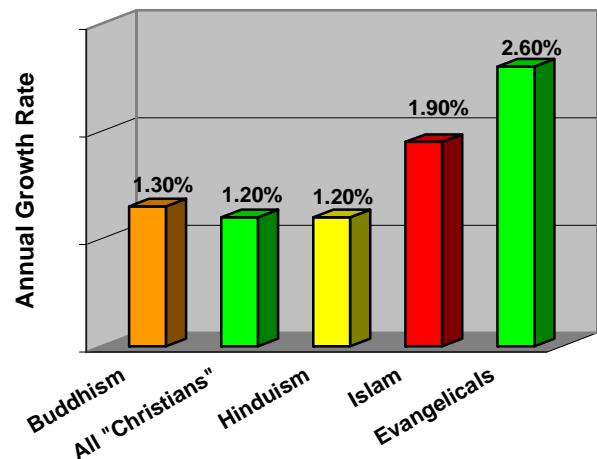
Long-term missionaries (4+ years) sent out by U.S. mission agencies has been flat to declining from 1985 to 2008.



Rise of African, Asian and Latin American Missionaries. Estimated missionaries sent over the next 15-20 years.

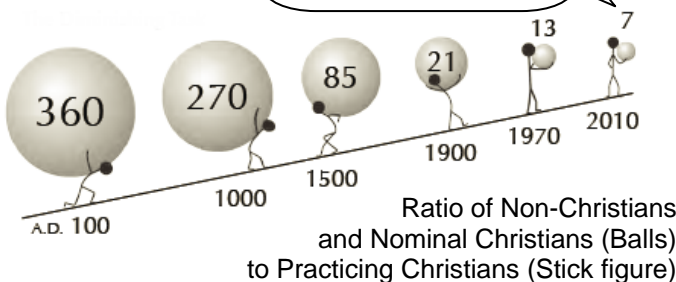


Major Religion Growth Rates
